

Guidelines on consent for photography and video recording

- Each individual club should seek consent from the parents/carers to take photographs of their children. There should be clear information about what these photographs will be used for e.g. publicity at an event, to celebrate achievements, on the website/local press etc. **A template is included on the next page.**
- A good time to gain this information might be at the start of the season when Membership – contact details - consent forms - medical information etc is being gathered.
- The CA have a photography/filming policy where those taking photographs on behalf of the SGB have to complete the appropriate forms and therefore are recognised at events as being in an 'official' capacity.
- Where there is a Match, Tournament or Festival taking place between 2 or more clubs and there is one or more children that should not be photographed, it really needs to be the relevant club officials of those children that raises this with the organisers of the event plus anyone taking photographs/filming. It would also be helpful if there was a process that this could be raised prior to the event with the organisers.
